Instruction Guide for Printing and Trying On a Paper Eye Patch Template

Note: This guide provides step-by-step instructions with explanations for printing a paper eye patch template, trying it on, and ensuring the best fit.

Materials Needed:

- Printer
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Paper (sturdy enough to hold its shape)

Step 1: Print the Template

Print next page in its size on Page A4. To ensure that the page is printed in its original size, place your credit card or ID card in the box below. If it exactly coincides with its outline, you can continue.

Step 2: Cut Out the Template

Using scissors, carefully cut along the outer edge of the printed eye patch template. The resulting shape should be the paper eye patch template.

Step 3: Try On the Paper Template

Hold the paper template up to your eye area without pressing it against your skin. Position the template so that it covers the eye area properly and comfortably.

Step 4: Assess Fit and Comfort


Look in a mirror and assess how the paper template fits around your eye. Adjust the template's position to find the most comfortable and suitable fit. Check the fit and comfort, making sure it covers the eye area adequately.


Step 5: Using the Template for a ordering Eye Patch

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

Patch Types

Remember a convex eye patch extends outward away from the eye. A Flat patch will fit under glasses.




Convex Leather Medical Eye Patch: It is designed to protrude slightly from the eye area. The curvature allows for more space between the patch and the eye itself. This type of patch might be used to prevent direct contact between the patch and the eye, providing more comfort for the wearer.

Flat Leather Medical Eye Patch: This type of eye patch has a flat surface and is usually designed to cover the eye evenly. It sits flush against the skin and provides a consistent coverage over the eye area.

How to measure your eye for an Eye Patch!

Measure from the top of the eyebrow down to the upper part of the cheekbone. Then measure from the outer edge of the eye to the middle bridge of the nose. This will give you an approximate measurement to choose from. Always double check your measurements. Different people have different shapes.



Elastic band length:
